ABOUT THE PATTERN

Magdalenasjal is a sleek, triangular shawl with thin rolled edges and a small opening. It is worked back and forth in stockinette stitch, with simple edge stitches that prevent the edges from tightening. The work begins at one side tip. In the first half, stitches are increased, before transitioning to decreases at the centre tip. The work is then divided in two, and each section is worked back and forth separately to create the opening. The sections are joined again, and the second tip is finished with decreases. Finally, the shawl is lightly felted by hand to achieve a soft, fluffy texture. For more information, see www.raumagarn.no.

CONSTRUCTION

Tip to tip

Worked back and forth

DIFFICULTY LEVEL 2 AV 5

Techniques used in this pattern:

Right- and left-leaning increases
Left-leaning decreases
Purl decreases

SIZES

Small (Big)

MEASUREMENTS

Width: approx. 40 (54) cm [15.75 (21.25) inches]

Length: approx. 110 (150) cm [43.25 (59) inches]

The small shawl wraps once around the neck. The big version can be worn once over the shoulders, or twice around the neck.

GAUGE

10 cm [4 inches] in stockinette stitch = 24 sts in width and 34 rows in height

SUGGESTED NEEDLES

Circular needles, size 3 [US 2.5] (for working back and forth), 1 stitch marker

YARN

Rauma Finull

YARN QUANTITY

100 (150) grams

COLORS

Option 1:

414 Dark grey heather

Option 2:

464 Dark brown heather

Option 3:

404 Medium grey heather

GLOSSARY

st(s) = stitch(es)

r = row(s)

k = knit

p = purl

Stockinette stitch = Knit on the right side and purl on the wrong side.

Reverse stockinette stitch = Purl on the right side and knit on the wrong side.

Est = Edge stitches. The 3 outermost stitches at each side are worked in reverse stockinette stitch.

M1R = Insert the left needle under the strand between two stitches from behind. Knit the strand as a knit stitch.

M1L = Insert the left needle under the strand between two sts from the front. Knit the strand as a twisted knit st (through the back loop).

Dec = (left-leaning decrease) Slip 1 stitch knitwise, place it back on the left needle purlwise, then knit 2 stitches together through the back loop (as when working a twisted knit).

P2tog = Purl 2 stitches together.

ABOUT GAUGE AND SWATCHING

Make a swatch and wash it in the same way you intend to wash the finished garment before measuring your gauge. Achieving the correct gauge in width is most important. The recommended needle size is only a guideline. If your swatch has more stitches than the stated gauge, use larger needles. If it has fewer stitches, use smaller needles.

PATTERN

INCREASE SECTION

The shawl is worked back and forth. Cast on 3 sts using 3 mm [US 2.5] needles. You will first shape the side tip. Work the following six setup rows:

Setup row 1 (= right side): P3.

Setup row 2 (= wrong side):

K1. M1R, k1, M1L. K1. (= 5 sts in the needles)

Setup row 3 (= right side): P5.

Setup row 4 (= wrong side):

K2. M1R, k1, M1L. k2. (= 7 sts on the needles)

Setup row 5 (= right side): P3. K1. P3.

Setup row 6 (= wrong side): K3. P1. K3.

Then repeat the following 2 rows:

Row 1 (= right side): P3. K until 3 sts remain, M1L, P3 (= 1 st more on the needles).

Row 2 (= wrong side): K3. P until 3 sts remain. K3.

Repeat these 2 rows until the piece measures approx. 55 (75) cm [21.75 (29.5) inches], or until you have used just under half of your yarn.

DECREASE SECTION

You are now halfway through the shawl and will transition from increases to decreases. Place a marker in the last st on the needles to use as a reference point for later measurements. Repeat the following 2 rows:

Row 1 (= right side):

P3. K until 5 sts remain. Dec. P3 (= 1 st less on the needles),

Row 2 (= wrong side):

K3. P until 3 sts remain. K3.

Repeat these 2 rows until the piece measures 25 (35) cm [9.75 (13.75)] from the marker at the centre of the shawl. Next, an opening is worked in the piece.

OPENING

Ensure that the next row is worked from the right side. P3, K15 (18). Place a marker on the needles.

Right side of the marker:

Work back and forth in stockinette stitch over the sts to the right of the marker, leaving the remaining sts resting on the left needle. The first 3 sts on the needles and the 3 sts closest to the marker are worked as edge sts, i.e. in reverse stockinette stitch. Work in this manner for approx. 3 (4) cm [1.25 (1.5) inches], ending with a row from the right side.

Break the yarn and leave the sts on the needles while the other side of the opening is worked.

Left side of the marker:

Starting from the RS (i.e. from the marker and outwards), work back and forth in stockinette stitch over the sts to the left of the marker, with 3 edge sts at each side. Continue to work decreases as before. Work in this manner for approx. 3 (4) cm [1.25 (1.5) inches]. On the next row from the WS, work across all sts again, including the sts on the right side of the marker. Edge sts are no longer worked on each side of the opening, only at the beginning and end of the row. The marker can now be removed.

DECREASE SECTION, CONTINUED

The opening is now complete. Continue working all sts in stockinette stitch, with edge sts and decreases as before, until 7 sts remain on the needles. Finish the piece as follows:

Finishing row 1 (= right side):

P2, p2tog, P3, (= 6 sts on the needles)

Finishing row 2 (= wrong side): K6.

Finishing row 3 (= right side):

P1, p2tog, p2tog, p1 (= 4 sts on the needles)

Finishing row 4 (= wrong side): K4.

Finishing row 5 (= right side):

P2tog, p2tog (= 2 sts on the needles).

Finishing row 6 (= wrong side):

Bind off by passing the right stitch over the left stitch. Break the yarn and pull it through.

FINISHING

To bring out the fluffy surface of the wool and reduce rolling, the shawl should be lightly felted. Rinse it thoroughly in warm water, then rub the fabric between your hands and against itself. Feel free to be a little rough with it! Some find this easier with a small amount of wool detergent, but this is not necessary. Continue for a few minutes, until the fabric has developed a softly fuzzy surface. Lay the shawl flat on a level surface and shape it to the correct measurements. Allow the three edge sts on each side to curl in towards the shawl, creating a cohesive and smooth overall look. Press the shawl and smooth it out well so it lies completely flat before leaving it to dry. If desired, finish by steaming the shawl lightly with a steam iron to achieve an even smoother result.



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
